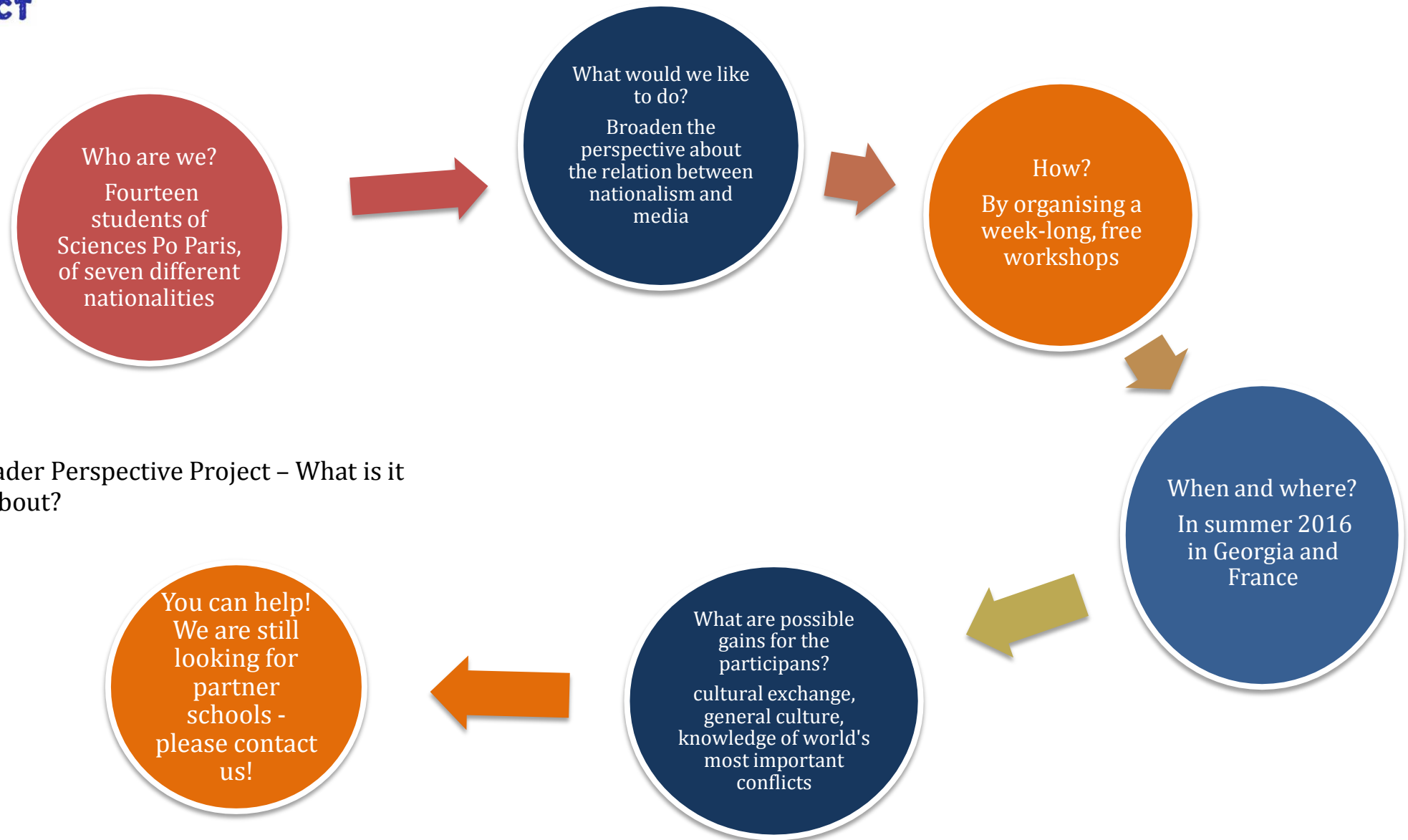


BROADER PERSPECTIVE PROJECT - SCHEDULE, SUMMER 2016: Workshops in BSU

Second day	Media and nationalism	120 minutes	Show how the media is used to strengthen the national feeling	Comparison of relation between media and nationalism during war and in times of peace, usage of propaganda
Third day	India and Pakistan	120 minutes	Employ case studies to corroborate ideas from previous days on real world situations but also show the complexity of these conflicts, contrary the oversimplification of political discourse	Conflict of Kashmir
