Requirements for design the materials, submitted to the Conference «Modern society cooperation and partnerships», which will take place on 1st of July, 2017 in Warsaw, Poland

Theses of the speech from 10 000 up to 15 000 typographic symbols with spaces, page size A4, use MS Word in format .rtf, .doc, .docx;

- fornt Times New Roman, size 12 pt, single spacing;

- page margins: left - 3 cm, top, right, bottom - 2 cm;

text alignment – by width, paragraph indent – 1,25 cm;

– the graphics (schemes, figures, graphs, diagrams) within the text should be alignment by width with the caption at the bottom «Figure N^{\circ} – Name of graphic» (for the caption – alignment by left) with the obligatory link on it within the article text;

– the tables within the text should be alignment by width with the caption at the top «Table N° – Name of table» with the obligatory link on it within the article text and indicated the source;

 $-\,$ the formulas should be created with the help of equation editor – MS Equation.

Notes: figures, schemes, formulas and tables should not alight from document margins. Pages are not numbered. Words are input without hyphens. Conference materials structure:

1. Metadata that is placed in material mother language and English (if the material mother language is English, then metadata should be only in English):

 Name and Surname (Names and Surnames – is several authors) – text alignment by left;

academic title, academic degree – after the Surname;

place of employment – text alignment by left;

location, country – after place of employment;

2. Theses title – in 1 line after the Metadata, text alignment by center, **in bold**. These title is noted in material mother language and English (if the materials mother language is English, then theses title should be only in English).

3. Text – in 1 line after the theses title.

4. References (if necessary) – in 1 line after the main text with the caption **References** (**bold**, text alignment by left). For all source material must be corresponding references.

5. Keywords are input in material mother language and English (if the article mother language is English, then Keywords should be only in English).
